AGROECOLOGY ACTIVITIES

1. During the period of this report on the agenda of the Agroecology program , we have implemented the following interventions:

The establishment of the demonstration center:

The implementation of the demonstration center started September 29, 2015 with a group of 8 people from the Saquiquib Community, primarily participating in carrying out , contour lines, terraces, and planting fruit trees. As The water level lines were marked by the Semesché and Ulpan students. They then proceeded to create terraces for growing vegetables. A trench for the evacuation of water was performed to prevent the wáter to over flow in the planting area. Boxes for the growth of earthworms were improved, placing a drain off the urine and placement of a black plastic bag for their protection. 18 - 20 fruit trees were planted and the stables for cattle / pigs and poultry were expanded.

2. 60 credits for 60 families to help create an income for their children studies.

57 piglets were given to the families, 3 families are still pending the support as they first are trained on how to use the stables, on animal care that includes proper feeding and vaccination.

Doña Manuela Caal Coc, of the Semesché community, is a member of one of the families of who the piglets were given.



3. Providing 25 hens for widows and single women in the Ulpan Valley to improve their income

Up to date, chickens have been provided only to 7 widows / single mothers and mothers of malnourished children in the communities, 18 women are pending. The reason why only 7 women have been given is because it is very hard to find Creole chickens that can be raised in the hard conditions given by families, however, the team is making efforts to get these animal to the families in Valley communities in the months ahead..

4. Help 10 families to be able to grow sustainable organic agriculture which they can promote

This objective hasnt been developed because of the families that were given the donacion of the piglets and hens 10 will be chosen to take on this new objective since they will be seen as modle families in the Valley Community.

5. Train 20 young men as promoters of sustainable organic agriculture

37 young men were are trained in relation to the construction of level A, making contour plowing, terraces and wormholes, while there was adult participation. The focus of the training process was skill development, so that the activities that are performed are very practical.

- **Actions to be taken during the period from January to April 2015:**
 - Planting of vegetable seeds, corn and beans
 - Care and maintenance of fruit trees
 - Continue promoting agro-ecological training fot young people and adults
 - Complete the provision of poultry and pigs as they come up in the project
 - Integrate 10 modle families in implementing organic farming, selecting them from different communities in the Ulpan Valley.
